

The Fringe has always been a space for trying out new things. For artists to take risks, experiment and create new work. For audiences to encounter new experiences and stories. Every time artists' names are drawn out of a hat for the Fringe lottery, the festival evolves and transforms.

In this spirit, we invite you to check out the brand new Fringe Spotlight Series and witness new work creation in progress with three companies sharing play readings at the SKAM Satellite Studio. You'll notice there are some brand new venues to explore — including the SKAM Satellite Studio, Pacific Opera Victoria's The Baumann Centre, Kaleidoscope Theatre for Young People (which hosts FringeKids), and a new collaboration with Global Pax Collective at the Ministry of Casual Living. All tickets will be sold in advance (no at-door sales) and there's a brand new ticketing system custom built for Fringe — it was developed for the original Fringe in Edinburgh.


