

Victoria Fringe Festival 2022

Transcript & Visual Description

CONNOR: Welcome to the Victoria Fringe Festival! We're back and live in person this year! When? Check it out!

CONNOR: This is a festival of independent theatre. Artists are chosen by lottery, meaning anyone can apply and no experience is required.

The poster fades away.

CONNOR: The festival will showcase local, national, and international shows in-person. There are a total of 26 different shows! Four of them have ASL interpretation. The first is a special event called FringeKids. That's for younger kids to enjoy and participate in. The other three are different shows. One afternoon or evening for each will have ASL interpretation. If you want more information, check out the other ASL vlog!

Fade transition; Connor continues.

CONNOR: Where is Fringe? This year we have six venues. We're going to show the pictures of each location now, with the address at the bottom.

CONNOR: How do you get tickets? You must book them in advance. They cost either \$11 or \$13 per person. If you identify as d/Deaf or hard of hearing, free tickets are available. You can book tickets in three ways. The first way is online.

Choose your show tickets, then look for the box labeled “promo.” Type in the Accessible booking code there. After that, there is a space on the form for you to share any accessibility needs or questions you want to ask. After that, you’re ready to buy!

The third way is by email or phone/VRS. You can also email first to set a specific time to call via VRS.

Seating will be assigned before you arrive. Staff will show you where to sit. If you booked a free accessible ticket, you will be assigned seating near the front with a good view of the performance and the ASL interpreter. Katrina will also be available to say hi and offer any support.
