Sensory guide with some visual stories for

'Pico and the Golden Lagoon' by Pico's Puppet Palace

There are some spoilers to the show.

What to expect:

The performance is approximately 45mins long.

The lights above you will stay on but will be dim.

It is OK to move and make noise.

It is Ok to react.

If you want to leave the theatre at anytime you can, you can go to the lobby. An usher will help you get there.

You can come back into the theatre at anytime.

Here is a picture of the set. The puppeteer will be behind the set throughout most of the performance, except when she comes out for the full moon boogie dragon dance. The musician will be visible on stage for the entire performance. In this picture is Pico the main character and some of the other puppets used in the show.



In terms of sound that might be difficult for some people, there are some moments to be aware of:

In the very opening scene there is a loud clang from the musician and crashing music as the plane of Pico is flown on stage and crash lands on the island.



When David is looking for birds with his binoculars there is a sudden abrupt noise when he is startled to see the plane that has crashed on island. These sounds are made by the musician on stage.



When David spots Pico having a nap against a tree, he goes over to wake her up. When Pico wakes up she screams loudly with surprise.

Towards the end of the show when the Pico meets the dragon there is a full moon boogie dance. This is when the audience is asked to join in with the dance movements and the musician plays some loud boogie woogie type music on the guitar and harmonica.



At the very end just before the plane takes off to fly. The golden treasure is sprinkled on the plane and the musician plays some soft high bells.

Throughout the show the audience is invited respond to questions and ideas and are encouraged to call out.

After the last scene the audience will clap and the performers will come and take a bow.

Afterwards the audience will leave the theatre.
