The Fringe has 5 venues this year and 4 unconventional show venues:

1. The Metro Studio, 1411 Quadra Street (at Johnson)
2. The VCM Wood Hall, 900 Johnson Street
3. The Baumann Centre, Pacific Opera, 925 Balmoral Road
4. The SKAM Satellite Studio, 849 Fort Street
5. Intrepid Studio, 2-1609 Blanshard Street

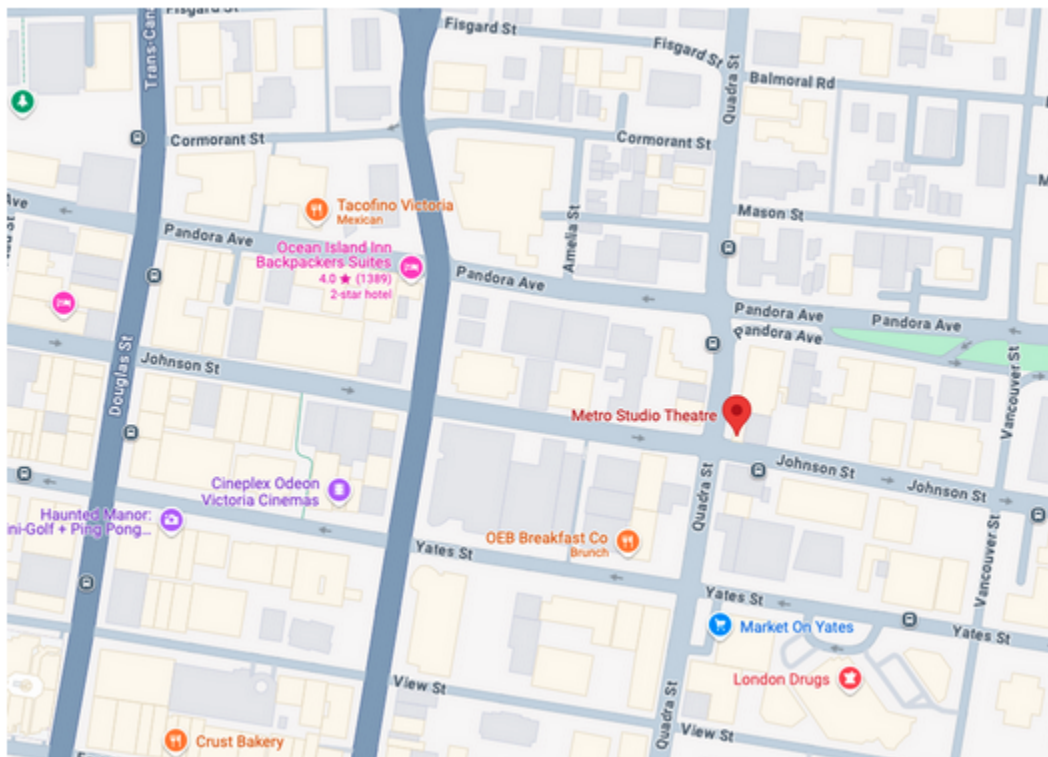

Wheelchair Accessibility

The Metro Theatre: 1411 Quadra St.

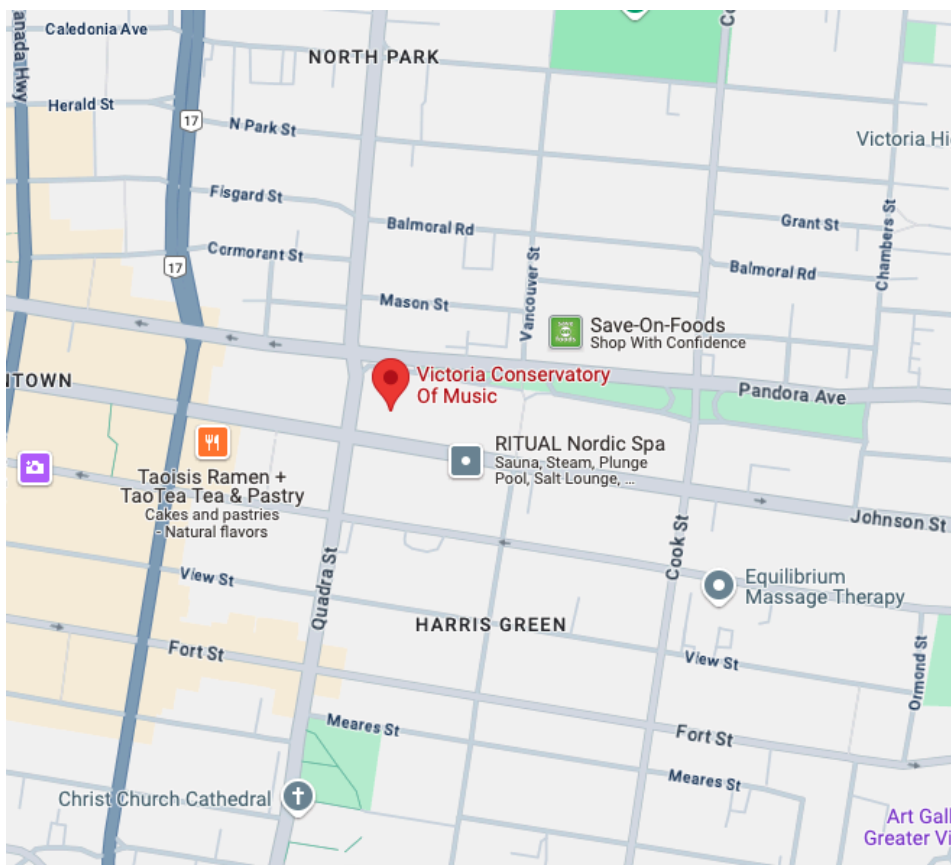


The Metro Theatre is wheelchair accessible, with seats on the ground floor for audience members using mobility devices. There is one wheelchair accessible washroom on the main level, through the door that also leads to backstage. Please let a Front-of-house manager or volunteer know if you need to use the accessible washroom (they will be wearing Fringe lanyards and nametags), and they will be happy to show you through. The main patron washrooms are up a set of stairs and are not wheelchair accessible.

Wheelchair accessible seating: Please indicate that you need wheelchair accessible seating in the provided field when you book your tickets online, or let our box office coordinator know when you book tickets in person.

Other seating needs: When you book tickets, there is a field that asks if you have any accessibility needs. You can type any needs or requests there.

The VCM Wood Hall, 900 Johnson Street

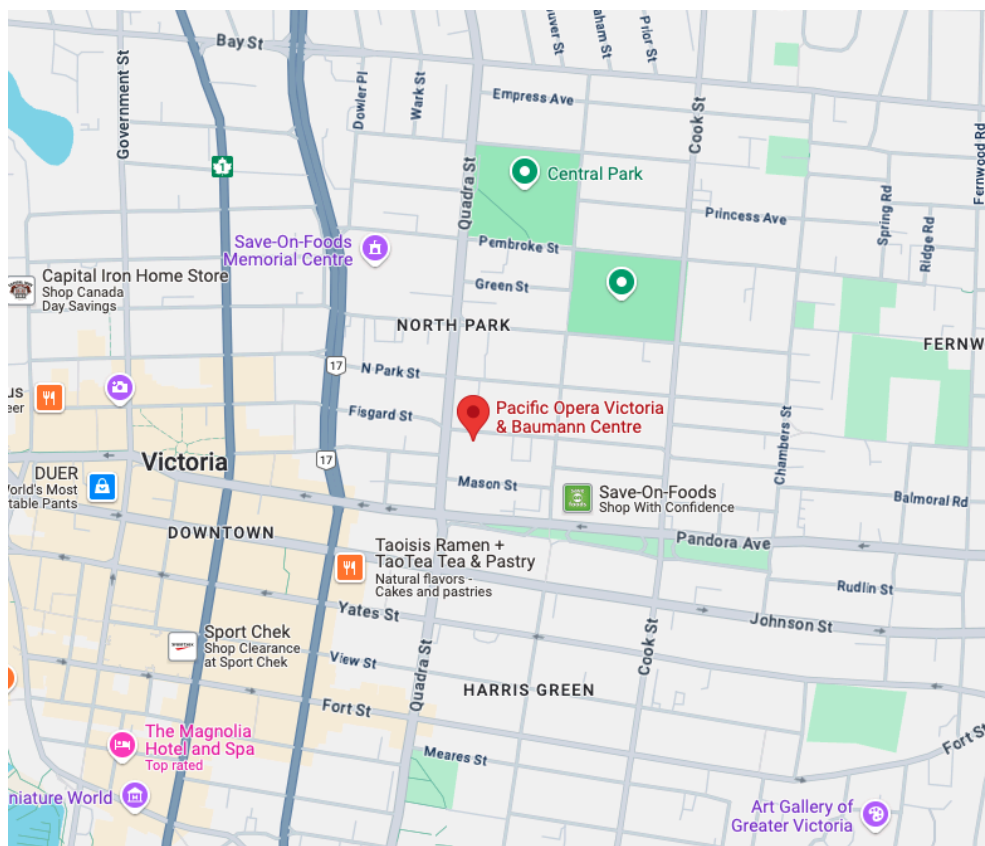


The VCM Wood Hall is an accessible venue, with a ramp leading up to the hall, and large floor-level space with adaptable seating. Washrooms are accessible by ramp and have grab bars in both, one of them being much larger and designed specifically for mobility aids.

Wheelchair accessible seating: Please indicate that you need wheelchair accessible seating in the provided field when you book your tickets online, or let our box office coordinator know when you book tickets in person.

Other seating needs: When you book tickets, there is a field that asks if you have any accessibility needs. You can type any needs or requests there.

The Baumann Hall: 925 Balmoral Road

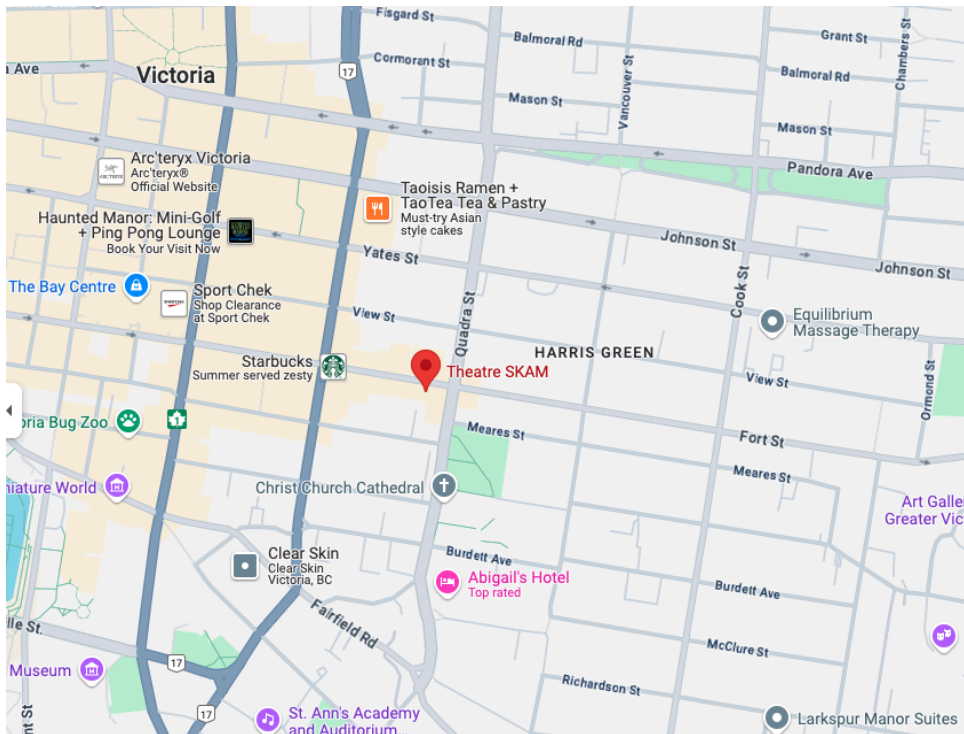


The Baumann Centre is accessible, with a ramp leading to the entrance and an elevator to the performance space. Washrooms are located upstairs, and both have grab bars in their accessible stalls. To use the elevator, notify the Front-of-house manager (they will be wearing Fringe lanyards and nametags) or a Volunteer.

Wheelchair accessible seating: Please indicate that you need wheelchair accessible seating in the provided field when you book your tickets online, or let our box office coordinator know when you book tickets in person.

Other seating needs: When you book tickets, there is a field that asks if you have any accessibility needs. You can type any needs or requests there.

SKAM Satellite Studio: 849 Fort Street

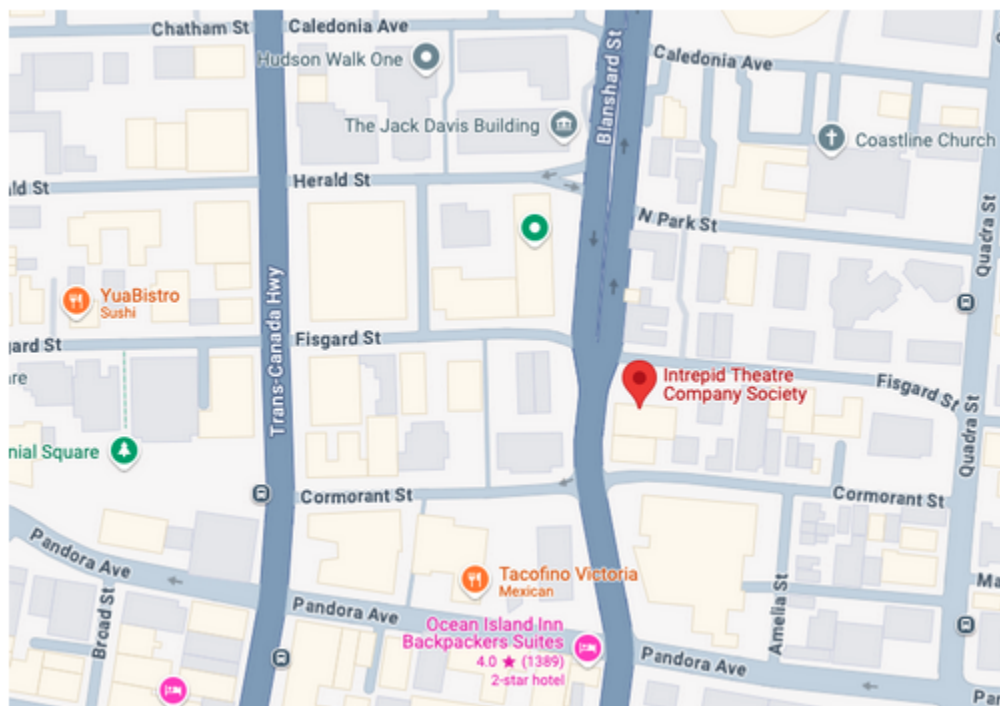


The SKAM Satellite studio is entirely on ground level, and has one accessible washroom near the theatre space. The stage itself is up a short ramp, and seating is adaptable.

Wheelchair accessible seating: Please indicate that you need wheelchair accessible seating in the provided field when you book your tickets online, or let our box office coordinator know when you book tickets in person.

Other seating needs: When you book tickets, there is a field that asks if you have any accessibility needs. You can type any needs or requests there.

Intrepid Box Office, Intrepid Studio, and Fringe Club



The in-person box office is located at Fringe Headquarters (Intrepid Theatre), at 2 - 1609 Blanshard Street (at Fisgard). The box office area is wheelchair accessible. There is no public washroom at the box office.

Hours: 12pm-5:30pm, Monday to Friday starting August 1st, and then everyday from Monday, August 18th to Monday, September 1st from 12-5pm.

For shows at Intrepid Studio and Fringe Club there are two single-user, gender-neutral washrooms to the right of the theatre. The left-most washroom is accessible and has a grab-bar.

Wheelchair accessible seating: Please indicate that you need wheelchair accessible seating in the provided field when you book your tickets online, or let our box office coordinator know when you book tickets in person.

Other seating needs: When you book tickets, there is a field that asks if you have any accessibility needs. You can type any needs or requests there.

Venue Guides & Accessibility Guides



A venue guide is available for each venue. Accessibility guides are available for some unconventional venues. These guides were created with folks on the autism spectrum in mind, but may be useful for everyone. They provide written information and pictures about what to expect at each venue when you come to see a show, including transit & parking, arriving at the venue, what to expect during a show, and more.

Free Accessible Tickets Program

Free tickets are available to all companions to patrons who identify as a part of the d/Disability community. Just call our box office at 250-383-2663 and ask for a companion ticket when booking.

We also offer a 'Fringe on the House' program*. If for any reason the cost of a ticket is beyond your means, we have a select number of tickets per show available for free, no questions asked. Just call our box office at 250-383-2663 or e-mail tickets@intrepidtheatre.com to book.

*Fringe on the House tickets are limited to one ticket per person, per show, up to a maximum of 5 shows.

All tickets need to be booked in advance. To guarantee a Fringe on the House or companion ticket, tickets must be booked before 3pm for weekday shows, and 12pm for weekend shows.

There are two ways to book these tickets:

1. **In person.** The in person box office is located at 2-1609 Blanshard Street.
 - a. Box Office is open 12pm-5:30pm, Monday to Friday starting August 1st, and then everyday from Monday, August 18th to Monday, September 1st from 12-5pm. Festival staff members will be there to offer support.
2. **By phone.** If you prefer, you can call the box office at 250-383-2663 during the above Box Office hours.

Front of House and Arriving at the Theatre

Seating begins 15 mins before showtime for all venues, except Venue 1 - The Metro Studio, where seating begins 30 mins beforehand.

Bring your confirmation email (on a phone or printed) to the show for entry.

If you have booked an accessible ticket, it will be accompanied by a free Fringe Button.

If you feel unwell at all, please email tickets@intrepidtheatre.com before the performance begins to exchange your ticket.

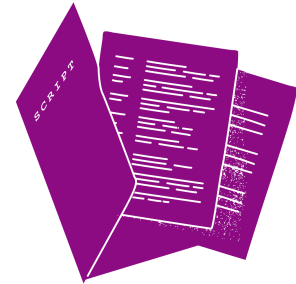
If you require priority seating, please arrive 25 minutes in advance and the Front of House team can assist you.

All shows start on time. Depending on the show, latecomers may not be seated.

While building the script library, we have in mind people whose first language isn't English, people who process information better textually, d/Deaf and h/Hard of hearing people, people who would like to review the script for content that may be sensitive or triggering, and anyone who would like to know more about a show's content in advance.

Visual Stories

A visual story is a guide for people to look at prior to going to the theatre so that they know what to expect during the performance. Visual stories were developed for people on the autism spectrum, and go hand in hand with relaxed performances (though there are no dedicated relaxed performances at the 2025 Fringe), but they may be useful for anyone who wants to get a sense of what a show is like before experiencing it.
